openly and happy to teach the younger generation. Touching hands with so many different seniors and experiencing all the different energies is truly something that cannot be forgotten or explained.

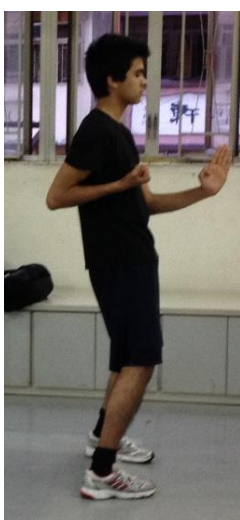
